## 877-BYSTORM

It can be very useful to be notified when a folder has been moved. Whether you are keeping an eye out for removal of sensitive data, or just helping users keep track of their files—the faster you know, the better. Here's how to do it:

Step 1: Run the 'Audit Folder Moves' common task. You'll find it on the main screen of FileSure.



Step 2. Run the 'Set up an E-mail Alert' common task.



This will take you to the 'Define Alert' screen. FileSure alerts are based on summaries that each computer running FileSure publishes. This allows a single FileSure server to monitor many computers without a performance impact. So we have to define a Summary. Click the 'Manage Summaries' button.



This will bring up the "Manage Summaries" screen where you can define what summaries should be published by FileSure. Click the 'New' button at the bottom:

This will bring up the "Define Summary" screen, which is probably the most geeky screen in the entire product. We wanted to provide maximum flexibility in the alerting engine so we decided to use SQL as our alerting language. We try to make it easier for you by providing a library of common summaries on the web. If you don't see what you need, let us know and we'll write one for you.

We've have a written 3 summaries for moved folders and you can see them by clicking on the little 'World' button.

Now that the Summary SQL definition has been copied to the clipboard we switch back to FileSure and paste it in the large area near the top . . . I also changed the name to 'Folder Moves Summary.'

We're going to leave the 'Oldest Record Age' at 1 hour since we don't want to get alerted on folders moved yesterday or last month, just tell me about folder moves that have occurred in the last hour.

Click 'OK' to close the 'Define Summary' screen.

Click 'Close' to close the 'Manage Summary' screen. When you close the 'Manage Summary' screen, the following message box will show up:



Click OK and wait a minute or so, then click the Summary drop down at the top and select the "Folder Moves Summary"

Here we're going to define the actual alert. Here are the steps

- 1. Change the 'Send e-mail when count exceeds' number to be 1. We want to get alerted on EVERY folder move and our summary is built for this.
- 2. Click the 'Select all' button,
- 3. Type in your e-mail address in the 'Mail to' field. This will send the alert to you.
- 4. Type 'FileSure Alert: Folder Moved on <%MachineName%>' in to the Subject field. You can right-click in the Subject text area to get a list of variables from the published summary.
- 5. Type '<%userName%> moved the folder <%fileName%> to <%renameTo%>' in to the Body field. You can rightclick in the Subject text area to get a list of variables from the published summary.
- 6. Make sure 'Enabled' is checked at the bottom.

In my test I moved the folder C:\Temp\idera to C:\temp\temp\idera and FileSure picked it, just like we expected.

It'll take a few minutes for the alert to actually show up, since FileSure publishes summaries in the background and then we have to wait for it to be sent via SMTP, then the e-mail server has to do it's magic...but in a couple of minutes....
